U.S. – MEXICO – CANADA TRADE AGREEMENT CERTIFICATE COMPLETION INSTRUCTIONS:

For purposes of obtaining preferential tariff treatment, a Certification must be made legibly and contain the minimum data elements as set out in Annex 5-A of the Agreement by either the IMPORTER, EXPORTER or PRODUCER of the good and be in the possession of the IMPORTER at the time the declaration is made. Please print or type:

- FIELD 1: Select who is making Certification Statement by checking either IMPORTER, EXPORTER or PRODUCER OF THE GOODS
- FIELD 2: State the full legal name, address (including country), telephone number, email of the CERTIFIER.
- FIELD 3: State the full legal name, address (including country), email and telephone number of the EXPORTER. If the EXPORTER is not known, state "UNKNOWN"; if multiple importers, state "VARIOUS".
- FIELD 4: State the full legal name, address (including country), email and telephone number of the PRODUCER. If more than one Producer's good is included on the Certificate, attach a list of additional Producers, including the legal name, address (including country) and telephone number, cross-referenced to the good described in Field #5. If you wish this information to be confidential, it is acceptable to state, "Available to CBP upon request". If the Producer and the Exporter are the same, complete field with "SAME". If the Producer is unknown, it is acceptable to state "UNKNOWN".
- FIELD 5: State the full legal name, address (including country), telephone number and email of the IMPORTER.
- FIELD 6: A) Provide a full description of each good. The description should be sufficient to relate it to the Invoice description and to the Harmonized System (H.S.) description of the good. If the Certificate covers a single shipment of a good, include the invoice number as shown on the Commercial Invoice. If not known, indicate another unique reference number, such as the Shipping Order number.
B) For each good described in Field #6A identify the H.S. tariff classification to six digits. If the good is subject to a specific rule of origin in Section 202 of the USMCA Implementation Act or General Note 11 of the HTSUS that requires eight digits, identify to eight digits, using the H.S. tariff classification of the country into whose territory the good is imported.
- FIELD 7: For each good described in Field #6, state which criterion (A through F) is applicable. **NOTE: In order to be entitled to preferential tariff treatment, each good must meet at least one of the criteria below.**

Origin Criteria

- A The good is "wholly obtained or produced entirely" in the territory of one or more of the Parties countries as defined by 4.3. Note: The purchase of a good in the territory does not necessarily render it "wholly obtained or produced".
 - B The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the Parties using non-originating materials provided the good satisfies all applicable requirements of product-specific rules of origin in Section 202 of the USMCA Implementation Act or General Note 11 of the HTSUS.
 - C The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the Parties exclusively from originating materials. Or
 - D Except for a good provided for in Chapter 61 to 63, HTSUS:
The good is produced entirely in the territory of one or more of the Parties, is classified with its materials or satisfies the "unassembled goods" requirement, and meets a regional value content threshold of not less than 60% if the transaction value method is used or not less than 50% if the net cost method is used (not including RVC for autos); and
 - E The good satisfies all other applicable origin requirements.
 - F **Rules of Origin for Automotive Goods**: The appendix to Annex 4-B ("automotive appendix") of the USMCA includes additional requirements that apply to automotive goods, including additional certification requirements.
 - G 7c. For all other originating goods indicate appropriately "MX" or "US" or "CA" if the goods originate in that USMCA country, within the meaning of the USMCA Rules of Origin Regulations using 19CFR102.
- FIELD 8: Complete field if the Certificate covers multiple shipments of identical goods as described in Field #5 that are imported into a USMCA country for a specified period of up to one year (the blanket period). "FROM" is the date upon which Certificate becomes applicable to the good covered by the blanket Certificate (it may be prior to the date of signing this Certificate). "TO" is the date upon which the blanket period expires. The importation of a good for which preferential treatment is claimed based on this Certificate must occur between these dates.
- FIELD 9: All these fields must be completed, signed, and dated by the CERTIFIER.
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
